



Writing guide for contributors to Geneva Impact Investing Review

Thank you for your interest and contribution to GIIA !

[Geneva Impact Investing Review](#) (GIIR) is a platform dedicated to all students to engage in emerging sustainable finance topics such as impact investing, ESG, entrepreneurship and environmental economics. We welcome student contributions in all forms e.g. blog articles, op-eds and book reviews, in the hopes to improve understanding of opportunities, challenges and concepts in sustainable finance, particularly in the impact investing field.

Once the contribution has been submitted to the editorial committee, the contribution will be proofread and edited by the GIIR editors. Changes to the format may be requested from the authors, in order to ensure that the contribution falls within the scope of the reason for statement.

In order to ensure the consistency of the review, please respect the following general guidelines:

Requirements:

- The text can be in English or French
- Article length: 500 to 1500 words
- Format: OpenOffice or Microsoft Word
- Citation: APA with in-text citations and Bibliography at the end (e.g. Lorem (2018)) OR direct hyperlinks to your sources.
- (**Optional) Photo of the author
- **Please submit your article alongside the submission form to gisa.giia@graduateinstitute.ch**

Notes:

- The text should be airy and contain paragraphs in order to increase comprehension. Do not hesitate to make frequent line breaks. Use short paragraphs, subheadings, and/or bullet lists to break up your article.
- Proofread your article before submitting it to us. Make sure to check your spelling and grammar.
- Attribute any quoted/paraphrased info with links to the sources.
- After your submission, our editors will get in touch with you shortly to publish your article within 2-5 weeks.

Terms of submission:

In order to avoid any legal and intellectual conflict, please ensure that the content of your submission is your property, and complies with the rules regarding plagiarism.

By being published on a reporting basis, you are solely responsible for the comments made.

1. **Use of schoolwork:** The publication of academic work (in its entirety or by extract only) is permitted on GIIIR, only in the case of citing that this academic work is the property of the Graduate Institute of Geneva. Or else, a contributor will have to rephrase his point entirely if he wishes to produce a post that is related to one of his previous works submitted to the Graduate Institute. Any publication that is the subject of a dispute will be immediately withdrawn without conditions.
2. **Use of future research / data:** All contributors will be urged to be cautious about publishing their research and data. Although their publications are protected, no one is safe from plagiarism. In this sense, contributors should limit the content of their publication which relates to their research to a simple synthesis, avenues for reflection or “dead ends” of research.
3. **Approval and verification:** All reviews will go through an approval process to ensure their authenticity. We will only remove comments if they are discriminatory, threatening, obscene, pornographic or if they infringe intellectual property or are otherwise illegal. Your email address will be used for verification purposes.
4. **Responsibility of the author:** In order to guarantee the full responsibility of the authors towards their comments, the following inscription will be inscribed at the bottom of each text: "The opinions expressed in this article are those of the author and do not engage reason of state."
5. **Withdrawal of content:** In the event that a contributor wishes to see an article withdrawn for reasons of state, simply contact the Editorial Board to request it.
6. **Image:** The editorial board supports the addition of illustration to accompany any article published for reasons of status. However, an author can submit an image / photo with his article if it is copyright free.
 - Image from a royalty-free stock image. Include the image caption, source and link to it so that the editorial board can verify the source.
 - Image or illustration made by the author. Include the caption of the illustration and the name of the author.
